



# Can you send lithium ion batteries in the mail

Shipped out of USA. When shipping papers (Bill of lading forms, Dangerous Goods Declaration forms) are required, all lithium battery shipments to, from or through the United States must have written emergency response information accompany the shipment.

The lithium batteries must be of a type that have successfully passed the UN38.3 tests and contain the necessary systems to prevent overcharge and over discharge between the batteries.

All packages containing lithium metal or lithium-ion batteries that can be mailed must be of sufficient size, sealed, and rigid. This ensures that the lithium battery mark can be affixed to the address without folding.

USPS Standards for Domestic Shipments Containing Lithium Batteries. Each cell cannot contain more than 1 gram of lithium; Each battery cannot contain more than 2 grams of lithium; All packages must contain a complete return address; For non-installed batteries, your package must have a DOT-approved lithium battery mark (UN3090)

DMM Revision: Mailings of Lithium Batteries . Effective May 16, 2012, the Postal Service(TM) will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM;) section 601.10.20 to codify that primary lithium metal or lithium alloy (nonrechargeable) cells and batteries or secondary lithium-ion cells and batteries (rechargeable) are prohibited when ...

You mail all items at your own risk. Among other exceptions and limitations that may apply, we make no coverage for damages available for shipments containing electronic goods that you ship in any packaging other than: ... If the electronic goods have lithium batteries, they must meet our requirements for domestic ground/surface mailing of ...

Yes, you can mail Lithium batteries. The best way to send lithium batteries is in a small box with lots of padding, so that they don't get damaged during the shipping process. ... In order to send lithium-ion batteries through FedEx you will need to contact your local FedEx office and ask them if they can ship these batteries.

The U.S. Postal Service has announced new final rules, effective immediately, that significantly impact the shipping of lithium batteries and other hazardous materials by mail.. USPS cites "a consistent and alarming rise in incidents involving mailed packages of both lithium batteries and other hazmat, including ... unlabeled or improperly labeled air-ineligible hazmat ...

There are many types of batteries that have different requirements when you wish to mail or ship them internationally: ... lithium ion and lithium polymer batteries are classified as Dangerous Goods by the International Air Transport Association (IATA) as they're highly flammable, react sensitively to environmental factors, and can cause fires ...

Some areas may restrict you from sending lithium batteries entirely, while others will put limitations on the types of batteries you can send. ... When you ship lithium ion batteries, use "UN3480" for single battery shipments and "UN3481" if they're packaged with equipment. For lithium metal batteries, include "UN3090" for ...

Multiple cell batteries inside the housing or casing exceeding 100Wh for each battery are nonmailable. Damaged/recalled individual batteries are prohibited and need approval. Domestic shipping via air: Maximum 8 cells or 2 batteries with or installed in the new or Manufacturer Certified Refurbished (MCR) equipment in the same package.

This includes alkaline batteries, nickel-cadmium batteries, nickel-metal-hydride batteries, and lithium-ion batteries. However, there are some restrictions. You cannot mail button or coin cell batteries, such as those used in watches and hearing aids.

**How to Send Batteries in the Post** The postal service is not allowed to ship any hazardous materials, including batteries. USPS Packaging Instruction 9E Lithium Metal and Lithium-ion Cells and Batteries -- International and APO/FPO/DPO. Lithium metal (non-rechargeable) cells and batteries and lithium-ion (rechargeable) cells and batteries are mailable in limited quantities internationally or to and from APO, FPO, or DPO locations only when they are properly installed in the equipment they operate.

The outside of the package must be marked on the address side "Package Contains Lithium-ion Batteries (no lithium metal)." d. Mailed Without Equipment. The following additional restrictions apply to the mailing of secondary cells or batteries without equipment:

USPS has official instructions and guidelines for shipping batteries. ShipSaving helps you to highlight the following information: All packages containing lithium metal or lithium-ion batteries that can be mailed must be of sufficient size, sealed, and rigid. No, lithium-ion batteries cannot exceed 30% of their full capacity when shipping. Does it cost more to ship lithium-ion batteries? Depending on the courier, you may be subject to paying an additional fee for shipping dangerous goods like lithium-ion batteries.

Additional restrictions on transporting lithium-ion batteries via air were implemented effective April 1, 2016, and are still in force today. These were also adopted generally "as is" by PHMSA in March 2019: State of charge. Standalone lithium-ion batteries (UN3480) can be shipped by air only with a state of charge of 30% or less.

Lithium ion batteries contained in equipment meeting the provisions of Section II of Packing Instruction 967 of the IATA Regulations. No more than four cells or two batteries may be mailed in any single package. Lithium battery mark labels are not required for packages that contain no more than four cells or two batteries contained in devices. UN3091

Lithium batteries (or equipment containing lithium batteries) are a dangerous good and present a fire and safety risk if carried incorrectly. As a result there are certain limitations around how they can be sent by

Except for mailpieces containing button cell batteries properly installed in the equipment they are intended to operate, mailpieces containing mailable lithium metal or lithium-ion batteries must be rigid, sealed, and of adequate size, so the lithium battery mark can be affixed to the address side without the mark being folded.

When using an air transportation service like Priority Mail, you'll need the UN3481 Lithium Battery Handling Label. Sometimes, you may need to ship with a ground-based service, like when the lithium ion batteries are separate from the equipment they power. In this case, you'll need to affix this UN3480 label.
