

# Computer locks up when opening system power

@Sathya: Thank you for the suggestion. I cracked the case last week and had the computer run for a day with an open case and the temps dropped into the 40s. This morning I inspected the CPU's existing cooling system and noticed a lot of dust covering the grills underneath the fan, so I cleaned those up.

Common Causes of Computer Freezes. Resource Exhaustion. RAM becomes fully utilized; CPU reaches 100% usage; Hard drive space runs critically low; Hardware Issues. Overheating components; Failing hard drive; Unstable RAM modules; Power supply problems; Software Problems. Driver conflicts; Software bugs; Operating system errors; Malware ...

As you may have noticed, computers can freeze or lock up for many reasons. Some additional common causes include: If a computer does not have sufficient memory for the programs it's being asked to run, it may freeze due to a lack of system resources.

Press Windows + "R" and type powercfg.cpl to open Power Options. Click on Choose what the power buttons do. Select Change settings that are currently unavailable. Uncheck Turn on fast startup (recommended). Click on Save changes. Reboot your system and see if it boots normally now. Disable Hardware Acceleration

Most PSUs are not like work or fail, like one day you press your power button and nothing happens, they tend to get unstable over the years of usage, and sometimes bring not enough voltage to the gpu or cpu. The drivers then stop working and either the system crashes, or freezes, or simply restarts.

Choose Restart from the pop-up menu, and your computer shuts down and restarts, hopefully returning in a better mood. Approach 3: If the preceding approaches don't work, turn off the computer by pressing its power button. (If that merely brings up the Turn Off the Computer menu, choose Restart, and your computer should restart.)

A faulty memory card is one of the most common causes of computer freezes. So before you invest in a new computer, check to see if your memory card is at fault. Microsoft has a built-in tool to help you do this. 1) On your keyboard, hold the Windows logo key and press R at the same time to invoke a Run command.

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more frequent so i started looking for a solution myself. i had previously ...

If your computer remains locked up, try the next solution. To restart a locked up computer, press and hold the Power button until the computer turns off. Wait a few seconds, and then press the power button to turn the computer back on.

**Solution 1. Run System File Checker and Fix the Freezing Computer** 1. Right-click the Start button and select "Command Prompt (Admin)". 2. Type &quot;sfc /scannow&quot; into the Command Prompt window and press Enter to run a full system scan. Leave the Command Prompt to run - this may take between 5-10 minutes.

For a completely frozen computer, press and hold the Power button until your computer shuts off. Then power it back on. Choose a date and time from the list, then follow the prompts to restore your computer. Windows PCs freeze for a variety of reasons. One instance might be a fluke, but repeated freezes suggest a problem you'll want to fix. Here's how to unfreeze and recover a stuck PC---and stop it from freezing again.

If you can open the Task Manager, you might be able to recover from the freeze.(You can also press Ctrl+Shift+Esc to open the Task Manager.). Select the &quot;Processes&quot; tab---if you don't see it, click &quot;More Details.&quot; Locate ...

Hello, I have a small issue. When I go to the Settings App and the click on System, the entire Settings App Freezes. I can close it out and I can access System with win key + Page Break. All other items with in settings work. I have tried resetting the Settings app and made sure I am up to date on updates.

If your computer is locking up or stopping responding while using a particular application, try uninstalling the application completely from the computer. Then reinstall it and browse to the software vendor's website to update the software to the latest version.

System has always had four monitors attached to the GPU (3DP, 1 HDMI). The issue cannot be replicated if only 2/3 DP monitors are plugged in, but anytime all 3 DP monitors are plugged in the system freezes 5m after sleep/display off



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
