



Did jimmy carter put solar panels on the white house

On this very day, June 20th, 33 years ago, President Jimmy Carter installed solar panels on the White House roof. Seven years after that, Ronald Reagan took them down. It was the end of 70s, a ...

Carter had a particular interest in developing solar energy on a larger scale--large enough to store energy or put electricity into the grid. In 1977, Carter motivated solar research by introducing the Solar Energy Research Institute, which still exists today and is called the National Renewable Energy Laboratory.

Since Jimmy Carter's decision to install solar panels on the White House in 1979, the property's use of solar energy has ebbed and flowed with each president residing there. In this article, we'll explore how each president since Carter has shaped the ways in which both the White House and the nation use photovoltaics.

To demonstrate the need for renewable energy sources, In 1979, President Jimmy Carter put 32 solar panels on the White House roof. The panels provided solar energy for the White House cafeteria, laundry, and other areas. Until President Ronald Reagan removed the solar panels in 1986, the White House had a seven-year solar water heater.

Jimmy Carter. Jimmy (James) Carter, the 39 th President of the United States, was the first President to install solar panels on the White House, and he used them to heat the water for the staff kitchen. Former President Carter's decision was certainly a symbolic one, as the solar panels were installed during the 1979 oil crisis.

The History of Solar Energy at the White House. President Jimmy Carter installed the first solar panels, generating carbon-free electricity on the West Wing roof of the White House in 1979. According to the White House Historical Association, the President called for a campaign to conserve energy and set an example to the American people.

Jimmy Carter was way ahead of the rest of America when he put solar panels on the White House. On June 20, 1979, he made a proud proclamation: In the year 2000 this solar water heater behind me, which is being dedicated today, will still be here supplying cheap, efficient energy....
