There are free drop-off locations throughout NSW or free postage options for up to 15kg of mobile phones and accessories. The following products are also accepted at your local Telstra, Optus or Vodafone stores:

Australia has a national recycling scheme for mobile phones that also accepts mobile phone batteries, accessories, landline phones, and other electronic items (see below). Run by not-for-profit MobileMuster, there are more than 3,000 drop-off locations across the country and a free mailing service.

The first step is to work out what type of battery you're disposing of. This should be written clearly on the side of the cell (or the top of the cell, in the case of button or coin batteries). Look for descriptors like &quot;alkaline,&quot; &quot;lead-acid,&quot; &quot;lithium,&quot; &quot;nickel cadmium,&quot; and others since not all recycling locations accept all types of batteries.

National recycling campaign Recycle Now can check if you can recycle your mobile phone at home or at a nearby recycling point so its materials can be used again elsewhere. Take the battery to a local electronic waste center. Search online for electronic waste centers in your area. These are centers that can safely dispose of hazardous electronic wastes, including swollen batteries. If you're struggling to find an e-waste center online, contact your city's hazardous materials disposal center for guidance.

Mail-in battery recycling programs are more convenient, but you'll pay for the service, with services like WeRecycle starting at \$44.95 for the smallest mail-in option. You must take batteries to an authorized recycling center, a universal waste handler or a household hazardous waste disposal facility. When you know how to dispose of batteries, you can help the environment. Dropoff sites typically accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. For single-use batteries, you can get a mail-order recycling kit.

When it's time to get rid of the batteries, start by checking local ordinances. A few cities and towns will recycle any batteries for you if you just leave them in a plastic bag on top of your trashcan. About half of states have laws mandating specific disposal methods for consumers.
