Neptune is the eighth planet in our solar system. It is located at an average distance of 2.8 billion miles (4.5 billion kilometers) from our star. The blue gas giant is the farthest and coldest planet in the solar system. It's a really cold planet, with average temperatures around -200 degrees Celsius. It's also incredibly windy, with winds ...

The sun is by far the largest object in our solar system, containing 99.8% of the solar system's mass. It sheds most of the heat and light that makes life possible on Earth and possibly elsewhere.

The giant planets Jupiter and Saturn lead our solar system's moon counts. In some ways, the swarms of moons around these worlds resemble mini versions of our solar system. Pluto, smaller than our own moon, has five moons in its orbit, including the Charon, a moon so large it makes Pluto wobble. Even tiny asteroids can have moons.
