If you are looking for the temp files for PowerPoint then the naming convention is pptxxx.tmp (where xxxx is a number) and they are saved by default in "C : Documents and Settings<username ...

By default, if you"re signed in, files are saved to your OneDrive. If you want to save the current file somewhere else, click the Location drop-down to see additional recently-used locations. If the ...

Navigate to the path you saved (exported) your saved list to your hard drive and select the file you saved. I.e., "Word MRU Files Backup.reg" then click the Open button. Windows will tell you that your saved "Word MRU Files Backup.reg" backup file has been successfully added to the registry and that"s it, you"re done.

Look for a file that has a name similar to the name of your presentation or starts with "ppt". You can sort the files by date to help narrow down your search. -Once you find a potential temporary file, try opening it in PowerPoint to see if it's the version of your presentation that you were working on.

If you have OneDrive, check that it's syncing, and look at the root folder again. Office loves to store files there for backup saving. Also try looking at the files in these locations: C:Users[Your Name]AppDataLocalMicrosoftOfficeUnsavedFiles. C:Users[Your Name]AppDataRoamingMicrosoftPowerPoint
